

#### Prayer for May 2024

#### Dear Lord,

#### 19th May – FIRE OF PENTECOST



## FOOD BANK DONATIONS – ST PETERS CHURCH, ASKERN- 🗺

**Community Reaching You**, CRY Askern Foodbank was started by St Peter's Church at Askern about 8 years ago. It is held in St Peter's Church Hall on Thursday mornings and run by volunteers including some church members.

#### CRY retains its original aim:

To provide, within a Christian ethos, support, and encouragement to all affected by poverty, ill health, or social exclusion in Askern and its environs.

**CRY's** main aim is to provide food parcels to those in need in the local community. Food parcels now include cheese, eggs butter spread and long life milk as well as a variety of tinned food and tea or coffee. We also now provide fresh fruit and veg. A bigger family food parcel includes fresh mince and frozen food items if the family have a freezer. **CRY** also gives out toiletries, toothpaste and brushes, personal hygiene products and sometimes dried pet food.

**CRY** Foodbank has been greatly affected by the cost-of-living crisis. A single food parcel costs £45 to £50 and a family food parcel about £75 to £80. Each will last about 5 days.

Although **CRY** gets financial help from DMBC, Askern Co-Op and food donations from some local supermarkets we really need community help too. Either money donations or the donation of food and other items as previously listed are needed.

The Foodbank is very grateful for the continuing support from the Church communities including the Benefice of Burghwallis and Campsall.

Without continued generosity the project would struggle to meet its goals in supporting those in need in our community, so we ask for continuing support in the form of donations.
