Courier and On-line Fraud! (Emailed from SY Police- May)

Online and over the phone banking has made life much easier for many people. Instead of having to go in store to manage your finances, it can be done from the comfort of your own home, or anywhere in the world, if you have phone and access to the internet.

However, there are also risks attached to online financial management that, if you are not aware of, can leave you vulnerable to courier fraud, and sadly it is often the elderly who are most impacted by this pernicious style of scam.

The most common way that courier fraudsters operate is by calling their intended victim on the phone and claiming to be from their bank, the police, or another trusted authority.

Once they have established a veneer of trust, the fraudsters will claim that an unusual payment has been spotted on your bank card, or that another party has been arrested for using your card details illegally.

They will then attempt to get your personal financial information - which should never be given out over the phone - such as your PIN number.

You may be directly asked for your PIN or asked to type it into your phone – you should never provide this information. The scammer may send a taxi to your address as a courier to pick up the card, and even the taxi driver may not be aware that they are part of the scam.

When the scammer has access to your card and your PIN, they will be able to spend your money.

Other methods of courier fraud include:

Being told to withdraw a large amount of cash that the scammer says will be used to help identify a corrupt member of bank staff and returned to you (it won't be).

Fraudsters posing as a police officer and directing a victim to purchase an expensive item - to help identify counterfeit sellers - which is then given by a courier to the scammer's partner.

Being told that your bank account has been compromised and that you need to transfer your funds into a new safe account, which is set up and controlled by the scammer, meaning that you won't see that money again.

To ensure that you are wise to courier fraud, we are encouraging people in South Yorkshire to bank safely.

Safe online banking means:

Never give out your PIN number over the phone – a bank will never ask for your PIN in this way.

- Remember, just because someone knows your name and phone number, does not mean they are calling from a bank or other trusted source. The person you're talking to may sound trustworthy, but it doesn't mean they are.
- If something doesn't sound or feel right, hang up and call your bank on a trusted number, not a number you have been given over the phone, or go in store to check whether the call was legitimate.
- Know that a real bank or the police will never pick up your bank card, cash, or other valuables by courier. If the caller you are speaking to is trying to arrange this, it is a scam.

Reflecting Faith: The Church

When you drive in the English countryside you should be able to see at least one church spire or tower from pretty much anywhere. Just about every village has its own church building. The size and grandeur of these



village churches varies greatly and was usually dependent on who paid for them in the first place! In the main they were built with money from the local 'Lord of the Manor'- not necessarily a 'Lord' in the titled sense, but the person who owned most of the land and properties. Most people would work for him and live in a house provided by him. The two went together. Often, to keep their job and home, they were expected to attend 'the Lord's' church. Many such churches were constructed at a time when people assumed that the more money you gave to the church, the greater would be your place in heaven. Hence the ostentatiousness in many a small village church!

By the early 1800s society had begun to change shape rapidly. The Napoleonic Wars which had been raging in Europe for many years were concluded at the Battle of Waterloo in 1815. There were new processes being discovered and invented which meant changes in working practices: the 'Industrial Revolution' was well under-way. 'Society' itself began to change with industrialisation bringing working folk into towns and away from the places, people, family members and authority figures to whom they had deferred all their lives.



Have a look at a village or city church and see if you can find out anything about its history. Was there any reason for it being built and where it is that reflects faith? Church events and Open Days are ways to find out more about their history.

The resident is then able to answer any supplementary questions that may arise.

Our local MP, Ed Milliband, is already involved with this issue and is due to meet with senior police officers soon to discuss the problem.

Unless there is an emergency involved, the number to call is 101. The more information the police have, the more effective can be their response.
