

ON-GOING APPEAL ST MARY MAGDALENE CHURCH Campsall

The weekend of a new month we can now announce that the repair work has begun to the SE corner of our church and we can look forward to uncovering the Pugin Altar in all its glory!

This has been made possible by grants from the Diocese and your Donations and when the work is completed it will protect the area above the beautiful altar from future rainwater damage.

Our very old boiler, second-hand in 1986, has so far this winter warmed our services however it may fail and it cannot be repaired due to its age and no parts available any more. Therefore, before we can obtain any grants, we need to raise funds towards part of the cost, hence our ongoing Appeal. Campsall Church like any parish church supports itself for all running costs and repairs and much needed repairs.

The Parochial Church Council will be arranging a date to invite members of the community who may be able to offer some of their time to assist in applying for grants and funding.

NORTON REMEMBERS Lest we Forget Year 3 & 4 Pupils



The Autumn term saw year 3 and 4 children from Norton Junior School embark on our first Expedition of the year entitled *Lest we Forget*. Our learning was centred around answering the guiding question: How does War change lives? and concentrated on the events of the second world war and how it impacted on those who lived during this time.

Working with Victoria Cross Trust, we found the details of seventeen servicemen from the local area who fell during combat or died because of being wounded. Several of these servicemen are buried at Campsall Cemetery, with many others honoured on the War Memorial at St Mary Magdalene Church, Campsall. Selected pupils from each class visited these War Graves and watched as they were cleaned by our colleagues at VC Trust.

Our core text, *Children of the Blitz* by Robert Westall, revealed the true devastation of war, seen through the eyes of innocent young people. This really brought home the difficulties families faced during those terrible years. Additionally, through working with Doncaster Archives, we were fortunate enough to uncover a school photo of Norton children in 1933 - the only photo held at the archives of Norton pupils in that century - this was also the year that Adolf Hitler became Chancellor of Germany.

We honoured these children, and the servicemen that we had studied, by drawing portraits of each and every one of them. This collection of work made up our large Poppy Mosaic displayed alongside another information board in Campsall Church.

We also explored the heroic stories of servicemen who had been awarded the VC Cross in Doncaster - receiving an expert talk from Keith Lumley who kindly donated a plaque to commemorate one of those men - Thomas Bryan VC. We also had expert visitors from people who are currently (or had just finished) serving in the British Military, namely John Riddle - a Royal Marine Commando.

Finally, as classes, for Remembrance Day, we made poppy wreaths using recycled plastic bottles and laid one of them at Alexander House as part of their annual service - a fitting tribute to the Armed Forces community, and all those lost because of conflict.

As long as you speak their name, they shall forever live.







Joshua led the Israelites across the river Jordan. They camped near the town of Jericho and prepared to fight.














